Non-credit bearing Graduation Requirements

1. College Seminar

College Seminar aims at widening students' exposure and developing awareness in knowledge outside their disciplines. Diverse topics will be discussed by professionals. Full-time bachelor's degree students are required to join at least eight Seminars before graduation.

2. Work-Integrated Learning Programme (WILP) - Internship

WILP Internship (480 hours) involves work-based learning experiences that are relevant to students' disciplines.
Students' Practicum as arranged by the academic programme is equivalent.
