A warm welcome to you!

The mission of Tung Wah College (TWC) is to provide quality tertiary education and nurture youngsters to possess the qualities of " $\mathbf{T} \cdot \mathbf{W} \cdot \mathbf{C}$ " (i.e. Talent in relevant professions, Wisdom in problem-solving and **C**ommitment to responsibilities) for the benefits of society. Since its establishment in 2010, the College has been developing very rapidly and now plays an important role in the self-financing tertiary education of Hong Kong.

Particularly, TWC has built up a niche in healthcare education and made remarkable achievements in several aspects to respond to the community needs, e.g.

- a. Training the greatest annual number of nursing graduates in Hong Kong
- b. Being the first and only self-financing institution offering professionally accredited degree programmes to train allied health professionals (e.g. Medical Laboratory Technologists, Occupational Therapists and Radiation Therapists) in Hong Kong
- c. Being the first self-financing institution registered under the Post-secondary Colleges Ordinance (Cap. 320) offering teacher training degree and subdegree programmes in Early Childhood Education to train qualified kindergarten teachers and child care professionals
- d. Offering the first local BBA degree in Entrepreneurship

Currently, the College has 4 Schools offering a total of 16 degree and sub-degree programmes in diverse disciplines with a student population of over 2,500. In 2018/2019, TWC will continue to offer programmes in different disciplines covering both health care and non-health care areas. Out of these, the degree programmes in Nursing, Medical Laboratory Science, Occupational Therapy and Radiation Therapy are admitted into the Study Subsidy Scheme for Designated Professions/Sectors (SSSDP) and put under JUPAS for application. Students admitted to these programmes would be eligible for an annual subsidy of \$70,000 from the Government. Besides, students taking other degree programmes are also eligible for the Government's non-means-tested subsidy of \$30,000 per year. The subsidies not only reduce students' financial burden but also reflect the recognition of TWC programmes by the Government.

We sincerely invite you to explore the opportunities in pursing your studies at TWC and make a wise choice to create a bright future!

About Tung Wah College

TWC is a self-financing tertiary education institution established by Tung Wah Group of Hospitals (TWGHs) which is the oldest and largest charitable organisation in Hong Kong providing a wide range of medical and health, education and community services to fulfil the needs of the society. The College went through the Institutional Review (IR) by the Hong Kong Council for Accreditation of Academic and Vocational Qualifications (HKCAAVQ) in 2010 and is registered under the Post-Secondary College Ordinance (Cap. 320) as an approved self-financing degree granting institution.

Taking advantage of TWGHs' strengths and expertise in medical and health, education, and social services etc., TWC aspires to become a renowned privately-funded university, recognized for high quality programmes focusing on practical application for both for-profit and non-profit organisations, while nurturing youngsters to be caring citizens with a sense of social responsibility.

Currently the College offers degree and sub-degree programmes in diverse disciplines (including Psychology, Early Childhood Education, Accounting, Business, Entrepreneurship, Health Service Management, Forensic Science, Medical Laboratory Science, Radiation Therapy, Occupational Therapy, Nursing and Applied Gerontology etc.) through four Schools, namely School of Arts and Humanities, School of Business, School of Medical and Health Sciences, and School of Nursing. The College has a student population of over 2,500 and has nurtured over 1,400 graduates.

In 2018/2019, TWC will have 4 degree programmes included in the HKSAR Government's Study Subsidy Scheme for Designated Professions/Sectors (SSSDP) and put under JUPAS for application:

- Bachelor of Health Science (Hons) in Nursing
- Bachelor of Science (Hons) in Medical Laboratory Science
- · Bachelor of Science (Hons) in Occupational Therapy
- · Bachelor of Science (Hons) in Radiation Therapy

Students taking these programmes are eligible for an annual subsidy of \$70,000. Students admitted into other degree programmes are also eligible for the Government's non-means-tested subsidy of \$30,000 per year with effect from 2017/2018.

PROGRAMME DESCRIPTION

The programme aims to equip students with business insights, professional knowledge and generic skills necessary to develop a professional career in the business world and in the non-profit sector. In line with its broadbased and professionally oriented curriculum, the programme provides students with flexibility to choose one of the Major options after their first-year study, namely *Professional Accountancy, Financial Services, Marketing, and Health Services Management*.

Each student is required to complete a minimum of 40 courses, out of which 12 are General Education and Language courses, 15 are core business courses, and 13 are specialized courses in the selected Major option.



- (3) to equip students with effective communication skills for the delivery of individualized care as well as for facilitation of teamwork;
- (4) to provide students with experiential learning opportunities to facilitate integration of theory and practice in their chosen profession; and
- (5) to nurture students' all-roundness by expanding students' understanding and appreciation of other cultures and environment.

Graduates can start their career in health and social care areas including hospital and community settings. In hospital, they can work at acute and non-acute units such as emergency department, operating room, paediatrics, medical and surgical units. In community setting, they can contribute to residential care services such as care of the elderly, care of the disabled. They can also work at family and child clinic, out-patient departments, ambulatory day-care centre etc. Graduates who wish to have career advancement as advanced practice nurse, nurse consultant, nurse manager, academic faculty member, researcher and etc. may pursue postgraduate studies in various areas such as master or doctoral degree in education, nursing, public health, social science, health service management etc.

CAREER PROSPECTS AND FURTHER STUDIES

This programme provides an area of specialisation for graduates to work with ageing population in multiple sectors. Graduates will be equipped with knowledge and skills required to work directly with older people or at the interface between older people and their environments in diverse settings ranging from residential homes to day care facilities, social welfare agencies, aged-friendly housing estates, or within the silver market business.

Graduates will have ample opportunities to pursue a career in areas such as aged care policy development, direct practice in health and social services with older people, health promotion and community development, silver market business and social research. They may enter the workforce as project coordinators or officers, and can be promoted to a higher position or advance to management levels after accumulating working experience in the aged care services. Graduates can also start a small business in the emerging silver market.

PROFESSIONAL RECOGNITION

The programme is recognised by The Nursing Council of Hong Kong (NCHK) as a pre-enrolment nursing training programme. Graduates are eligible to apply for the enrolment as Enrolled Nurses (ENs) "登記護士" under the Nurses Registration Ordinance (Cap 164) of Hong Kong.

CAREER PROSPECTS AND FURTHER STUDIES

After graduates have received their EN licenses, they may work in hospitals and residential care settings of the publicly and privately owned organisations as well as the non-profit organisations. Qualified ENs can be case managers if they are employed in the elderly care and rehabilitation services.

Graduates may also pursue a bachelor's degree programme in Nursing or other disciplines at TWC and other local or overseas institutions.

General Admission Requirements

DEGREE PROGRAMMES

Year 1 Entry

For Year 1 entry to degree programmes, applicants should meet one of the following requirements:

- 1. Have obtained Level 3 in Chinese Language and English Language and Level 2 in Mathematics and Liberal Studies plus one Elective/Applied Learning Subject at Level 2 ("3322+2") in HKDSE; OR
- Have passes in AS Use of English and AS Chinese Language and Culture plus one AL subject/two AS subjects in HKALE and Level 2 for Chinese Language and English Language plus passes in three other subjects in HKCEE; OR
- 3. Have obtained the International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma with a minimum score of 28 and fulfilled the English language requirements:
 - i. Grade 4 or better in the Higher Level English Language (B Syllabus); or
 - ii. Grade 5 or better in the Standard Level English Language (B Syllabus); or
 - iii. Grade 4 or better in the Higher or Standard Level English Language (A1 or A2 Syllabus); or
 - iv. Grade 4 or better in the Standard Level English Text and Performance; or
 - v. Grade 4 or better in the Standard Level English Literature and Performance (A1 syllabus); OR
- 4. Have met the 2nd cut-off line of the respective province for admission to mainland key universities in the National Joint College Entrance Examination (JEE) and the scores of English Language is over 100 (普通高 等學校聯合招生考試(JEE,PRC)達到所屬省市報讀第二批重點高校分數線以上及英語科達100分或以上); OR
- 5. Have obtained equivalent qualifications (such as meeting the admission requirements of a degree programme offered outside Hong Kong).

Senior Year Entry

Individual undergraduate programmes admit students for senior year entry. Applicants should meet one of the following requirements:

- 1. Have completed an Associate Degree Programme (AD) or Higher Diploma Programme (HD) of the relevant subject/discipline; OR
- 2. Have obtained equivalent qualifications.

Students admitted to the Senior Year may be required to satisfactorily complete some bridging courses. The bridging courses can be Discipline courses or General Education courses offered in the first two years of the curriculum.

SUB-DEGREE PROGRAMMES

Year 1 Entry

For Year 1 entry to sub-degree programmes, applicants should meet one of the following requirements:

- 1. Have obtained Level 2 in five HKDSE subjects including Chinese Language and English Language ("22+222"). (Each applicant is allowed to use not more than two Applied Learning subjects in the application); OR
- 2. Have obtained a pass in one AL subject or passes in two AS subjects in HKALE and five passes in HKCEE including Chinese Language and English Language; OR
- 3. Have obtained a pass in one AL subject or passes in two AS subjects in HKALE and three passes in HKCEE plus Level 2 for Chinese Language and English Language; OR
- 4. Have successfully completed a Pre-Associate Degree programme; OR
- 5. Have successfully completed Diploma Yi Jin programme; OR
- 6. Have met the 2nd cut-off line of the respective province for admission to mainland key universities in the National Joint College Entrance Examination (JEE) (普通高等學校聯合招生考試(JEE,PRC)達到所屬省市報讀 第二批重點高校分數線以上); OR
- 7. Have obtained equivalent qualifications; OR
- 8. Have reached the age of 21 and above.

Note: Mainland students will NOT be admitted until formal agreement to the admission is given by the Ministry of Education of the PRC.

ALTERNATIVE CHINESE LANGUAGE (ACL) FOR NON-CHINESE SPEAKING STUDENTS

Graduation Requirements

To be considered for the award of a qualification, a student shall:

- 1. Have completed the minimum required credit units as prescribed for the programme with a Graduation Grade Point Average (gGPA) of at least 2.0.
- 2. Have achieved GPA of 1.0 or above for all courses in the programme;
- 3. Have satisfied the requirements of the graduation project / practicum, if any, as prescribed for the academic programme;
- 4. Have completed the Work Integrated Learning Programme / Co-operative Education Scheme / Community Service programme, if any, as required by the programme; and
- 5. Have attained a valid score of 6.0 in IELTS or equivalent (for degree level programmes only). (Students would be considered as having fulfilled the requirement if they have obtained a valid score in IELTS or equivalent at the commencement of the programme.)
