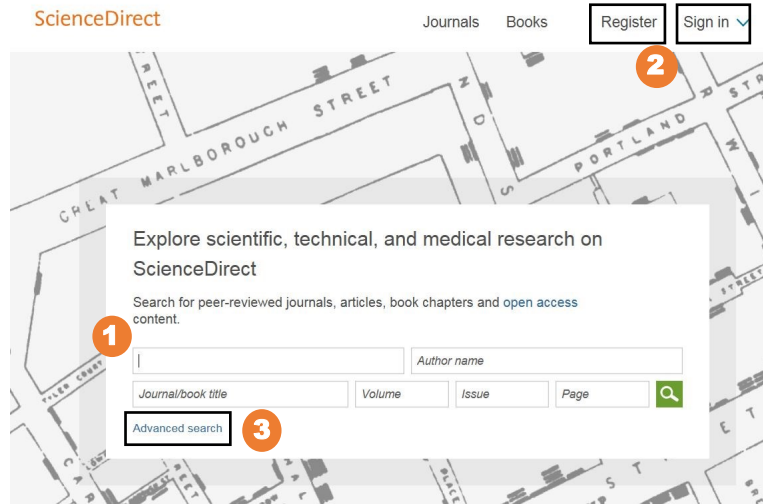


Searching ScienceDirect



1 Quick search

Enter search terms in the appropriate fields and click the search icon.

2 Register or Sign in your personal account

Select **Register** or **Sign in** at the top of any ScienceDirect page.

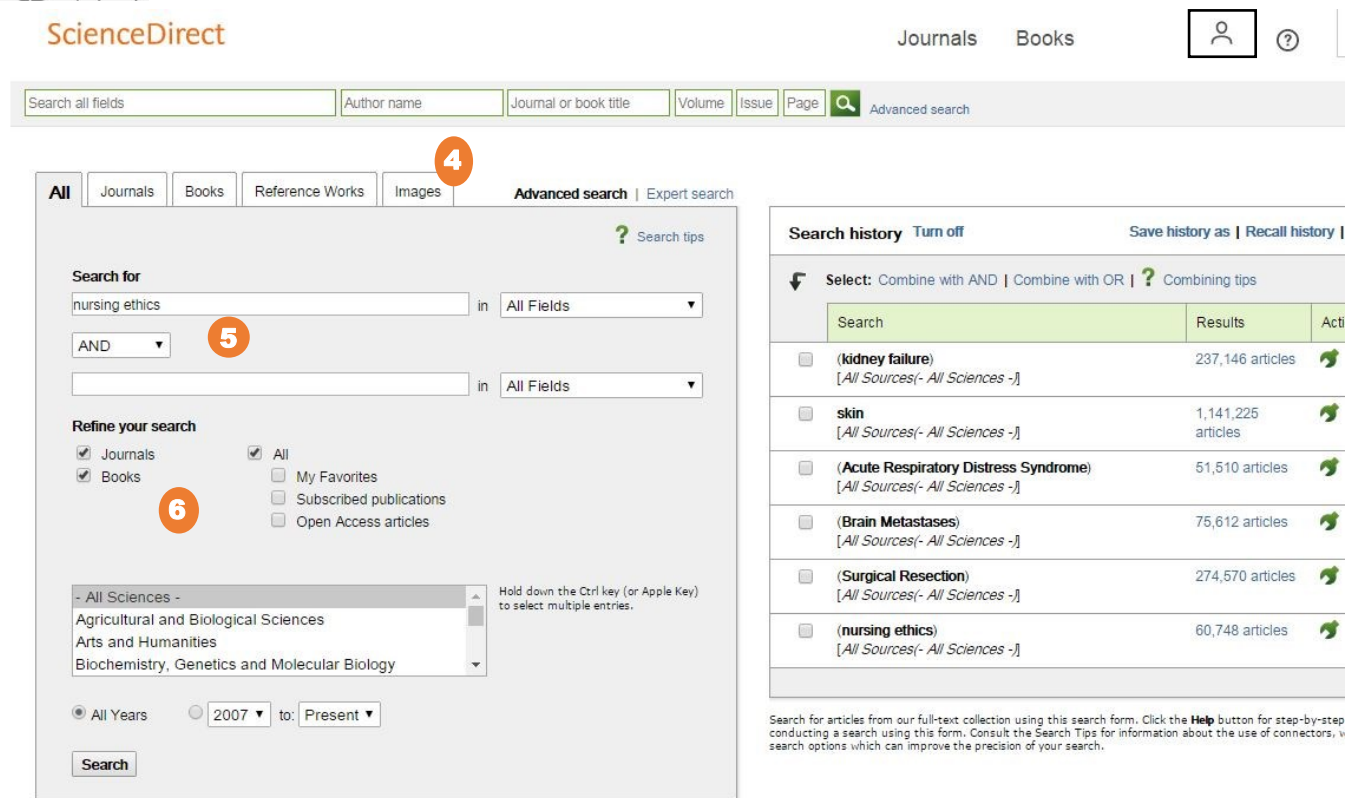
3 Advanced search

Go to the **Advanced search** form to search specific items or access your search history (Sign in personal account first).

4 Search across all sources or specifically for Journals, Books, Reference Works or Images.

5 Enter search terms in the space(s) provided, select which fields you wish to search (article, title, etc.), and use Boolean operators to combine search terms.

6 Refine your search to journals, books, open access articles, subject area and/or years.



Your Search Results (in Advanced search)

1 About your search results

Display the number of search results.

2 Set a search alert

Notify you by email (Save search alert) or RSS when a new article matching your search criteria becomes available (requires Sign in).

3 Download PDFs

Download full-text PDFs of selected articles all at once and automatically assign file name based on specified rules.

4 Export citation information

Export citation information for the selected articles directly to Mendeley, RefWorks, or into a preferred format.

5 Sort search results

Search results are listed by relevance by default. You can change to list by date.

6 Filter by access types

Choose to view All access types, only Open Access articles, or only Open Archive articles.

7 Refine filters

Limit search results by Year, Published Title, Topic and/or Content type.

8 Access rights

View whether the results are available for your institution in full-text (subscribed or open access or open archive or abstract only (non-subscribed) with purchase options for full-text).

9 Display article content

Click the article title to display the article content (HTML full text or abstract).

10 Supplementary content

Access content such as underlying datasets and author provided videos.
