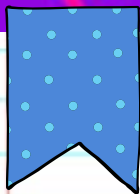

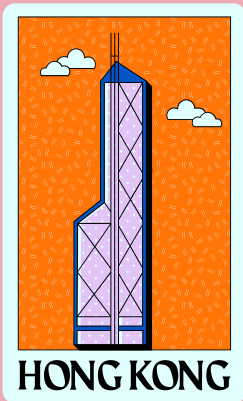

HONG KONG IDENTITY (HKID) CARD

According to the Registration of Persons Ordinance, non-local students permitted to stay in Hong Kong for more than 180 days MUST apply for the Hong Kong Identity (HKID) Card at the Immigration Department within 30 days of arrival. You are therefore required to apply for a HKID card in person at the Immigration Department as soon as possible. To save time, you may make an advanced booking via the following channels:

PROCEDURES:

1. Book Appointment (Online or by Phone)
2. Bring supporting document (booking confirmation + Student visa + Passport / PRC Exit-Entry Permit to and from Hong Kong & Macau)
3. Reach Registration of Persons Office as booked
4. Get your HKID Card after 10 working days
5. Remember to carry it EVERYDAY!

tips on opening a **BANK** account



BANK ACCOUNT OPENING

The majority of banks in Hong Kong opens on Monday to Friday and Saturday morning (except public holidays).

DOCUMENTS FOR OPENING A SAVINGS ACCOUNT

- 1) Passport/travel document(s), (e.g. Chinese Travel Permit for Mainland Students);
- 2) Proof of your permanent address in your own country (e.g. original bank statement in English/Chinese, issued in the last three months, latest driving license in English/Chinese) and/or proof of your current address (a letter from office of student residences, tenancy agreement, etc.);
- 3) Student Identity card and letter of admission to TWC;
- 4) Proof of residential address in Hong Kong in English;
- 5) Contact phone number and email address in Hong Kong; and
- 6) Hong Kong Identity (HKID) Card (if any).

NOTES

- Banks may require additional documents in opening of account or reject applications of persons from certain countries. Please allow more time to process bank account opening.
- Students under Age 18 must be accompanied in person by their **parent(s) or legal guardian** (please contact SAO for advice) to open a bank account at one of the local banks. For details, please check with the local banks directly.

PHONE SERVICES

Most of the Hong Kong residents own mobile phones and use them frequently. To keep in touch with your friends and families outside and inside Hong Kong, you may need phone service. There are two types of phone services provided in Hong Kong.



1) PRE-PAID CARD – PAY AS YOU GO

Both local and international calling cards are offered.

- Can be used instantly.
- Can be bought at any convenience stores like 7-11 and Circle K.
- Credits can be topped up by buying recharge card at the convenience stores or the stores of network providers.

Some recharge cards are only sold in designated shops or their service centers. You need to confirm where the recharge cards are sold.

2) PLAN SERVICE

- Requires signing of contract with:
 - i) Address proof for registration; and
 - ii) Hong Kong Identity Card.
- Need to go to the designated service center for registration.
- Monthly payment.

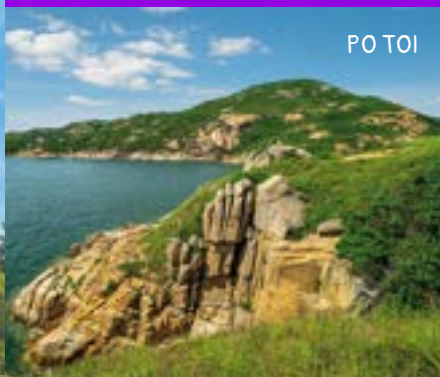

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

To be considered for the award of the qualification, students are required to fulfill the followings. For more details, please refer to Student Handbook.

IMPORTANT!

1. With a Graduation Grade Point Average (gGPA) of at least 2.0;
2. Have achieved GPA of 1.0 or above for all courses in the programme;
3. Have satisfied the requirements of the graduation project / practicum, if any, as prescribed for the academic programme;

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

To be considered for the award of the qualification, students are required to fulfill the followings. For more details, please refer to Student Handbook.

IMPORTANT!

4. Have completed all the programme requirements (including but not limited to Work-Integrated Learning Programme / Community Service Programme / General Education Framework);
5. Have attained a valid score of 6.0 in IELTS Academic or equivalent (for degree level programmes only). Students would be considered as having fulfilled the requirement if they have obtained a valid score in IELTS or equivalent at the commencement of the programme.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS - WORK-INTEGRATED LEARNING PROGRAMME (WILP)

Work-Integrated Learning Programme (WILP) involves work-based learning experiences that take place in an organisational context relevant to a student's future profession, or the development of generic skills that will be valuable to that profession.

The aim of the WILP is to bridge the gap between classroom learning and the real world, thereby enabling students to integrate their knowledge, concepts and skills learned from textbooks or classrooms in a practical way in the workplace, and to positively influence their career planning.

The programme comprises of two components i.e. Full-time Discipline Related Internship and College Seminars.

All first-year entry students, and those as required by the programmes, are required to complete a total of 30 hours of community service during their course of study to fulfill the graduation requirement. The distribution of these 30 community service hours will be as follows:

- Recognised College-Based Service Hours: 10 hours maximum
- Community-Based Service Hours: No limit

This requirement only applies to students enrolling from the academic year 2024/2025 onwards, including students undertaking programme transition. Students from AY2023/2024 and earlier are not affected by this new policy.

WORK TIPS – REGULATION & TYPE

BACHELOR'S DEGREE OR ABOVE

Non-local students studying a full-time, locally accredited programme at degree level or above with a study period of no less than one academic year will receive a “No Objection Letter” (NOL) issued by Immigration Department upon approval of application for student visa / visa extension of stay. With this NOL, eligible students are then allowed to take up study / curriculum-related internship / placement, part-time on-campus employment and summer employment.

STUDY / CURRICULUM RELATED INTERNSHIP / PLACEMENT

- The Internship must be arranged or endorsed by the programme offering department.
- Duration of the internship is up to one academic year, or one-third of the normal duration of the relevant full-time study programme, whichever is shorter.
- There is no restriction on work location, salary and working hours.

PART-TIME ON CAMPUS EMPLOYMENT

- The working hours for part-time on-campus employment shall not be more than 20 hours per week throughout the year.
- Students may only work at the on-campus “Designated Operators”. If the work location is outside campus, the employer must be TWC.

SUMMER EMPLOYMENT

- Summer employment is to be undertaken during the summer months (i.e. 1 June – 31 August, both dates inclusive).
- There is no restriction on work location, working hours, nature of work and employers.

WORK TIPS – REGULATION & TYPE

BACHELOR'S DEGREE OR ABOVE

Besides, with effect from 1 November 2024, non-local of full-time locally-accredited local programmes at undergraduate level or above whose study period is not less than one academic year are temporarily exempted from the above employment restrictions that they may take up employment in Hong Kong during the currency of their limit of stay or within the effective period as specified in the “No Objection Letter” (NOL) issued to them (if applicable), whichever is the shorter.

WORK TIPS – REGULATION & TYPE

HIGHER DIPLOMA

Non-local students enrolled in full-time locally-accredited sub-degree local programmes with a study period not less than 2 academic years may apply to take up an internship if the following conditions are met:

- the internship must be mandatory, study/curriculum-related and be arranged / endorsed by the institutions they are studying in; and
- the duration of the internship is up to 6 months.

MEDICAL CARE AND INSURANCE

ACCESS TO SPECIALIST CARE OR HOSPITALISATION:

When specialist care and hospitalisation are required, you can consider using the services provided at public clinics and general wards of government hospitals. The charge for those holding a Hong Kong Identity (HKID) Card is subsidised. Non-local students without a HKID card are required to pay full fees for services and hospitalisation in government hospitals.

For details of the fees charged by government hospitals, please visit www.ha.org.hk (Services Guides --> Fees and Charges).

INSURANCE:

Non-local students who are going to spend more than 180 days in Hong Kong are eligible to apply for a Hong Kong Identity (HKID) Card. As it takes time to obtain the HKID card, you are strongly advised to get your own medical insurance to cover your first month of stay.

Many insurance policies are strictly on a reimbursement basis. Non-local students, even with insurance coverage, may have to settle the medical bill first before you can claim reimbursement. It is important for you to check carefully with your insurance company on the extent of coverage and claim procedures, and set aside a sum of money for contingencies.

Non-local students are advised to purchase Personal Accident Insurance for the coverage of personal activities and living in Hong Kong.

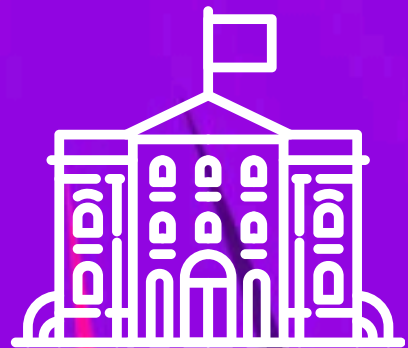
