Regulations Governing the Conducting of the Election of Student Representatives on boards or committee in Tung Wah College

1. Introduction

This paper stipulates the regulations (the Regulations) governing the conducting of the election of Student Representatives on boards or committees in Tung Wah College (the College).

2. Boards or committees in the College that include member(s) of Student Representative:

3. Timetable

- 3.1 The period of nomination is 1 December to 31 December every year.
- 3.2 The period for the election campaign is 1 January to 21 January every year.
- 3.3 The date of voting is one specified date falls between 22 January to 31 January every year.
- 3.4 The Chairman of the STUAC may make decision to postpone the timetable for not more than one month in special situation.

4. Election Officer

- 4.1 A staff as nominated by the Head of Student Affairs and approved by the Chairman of STUAC shall act as the Election Officer for the election of Student Representatives.
- 4.2 The Election Officer shall be responsible for the implementation of these regulations as well as the proper conducting of an election in a fair manner to all candidates.

5. Nomination

- 5.1 All TWC full-time students who would like to run for the election should have nomination from at least 10 full-time TWC students who have the voting right with the confirmation from Election Officer that he/she has no student disciplined record during his/her study in the College.
- 5.2 The Election Officer should process the nomination within 5 working days and advise the confirmation result to the respective student.
- 5.3 Each student is allowed to run for at most two posts of Student Representative at the same term.
- 5.4 If there is no nomination, the Election Officer will announce the relevant post be in vacant for that term.

6. Voting Procedures

- 6.1 Electronic voting in Blackboard or any other electronic platform which is approved by the Chairman of STUAC will be adopted.
- 6.2 Every full-time TWC student will have one vote for each board/committee in the College.
- 6.3 Only the full-time students from the respective School are eligible to vote for the Student Representative of that School Board.
- 6.4 No proxy will be allowed.

7. Determination and Confirmation of Results

- 7.1 The Election will be valid with at least 10% of full-time TWC students' valid vote.
- 7.2 As for the election of Student Representatives of School Board, the counting of 10% should be the total number of full-time TWC students at the respective School.
- 7.3 The candidate who has received the most valid votes shall be declared duly elected.
- 7.4 The Election Officer should make announcement to all students and staff no later than the next working day once the confirmed results have been reached.
- 7.5 If two or more candidates receive the same number of votes, a further election in respect of these candidates shall be held, details of which shall be determined and announced by the Election Officer as soon as practicable.

8. Term of office

The term of office will be started from the day of announcement according to clause 7.2 for one year.

9. Re-election

- 9.1 Re-election is required when any seat of student representative in Board / Committee is in vacancy.
- 9.2 Head of Student Affairs is authorized to assign an Election Officer to arrange re-election within one month after the vacancy happened by following the above regulations.
- 9.3 The term of office for the Student Representative(s) through Re-election will be ended on the same day of the Student Representative who is elected through the Annual Election as specified in clause 3.
- 9.4 If the re-election of any post which has been conducted for once or the term of office of the vacancy is less than 3 months, Head of Student Affairs may make a decision not to conduct the Reelection.

10. Amendment

The Regulations shall be reviewed from time to time and any amendment should be made under the approval of the STUAC.
