The Tung Wah College Global Student Ambassador programme (GSA) aims to nurture a culture of civic engagement and global enrichment.

The programme provides valuable opportunities for students to learn to serve and serve to learn as an ambassador for TWC while strengthens their sense of belonging to the College through being a student representative in serving the community.



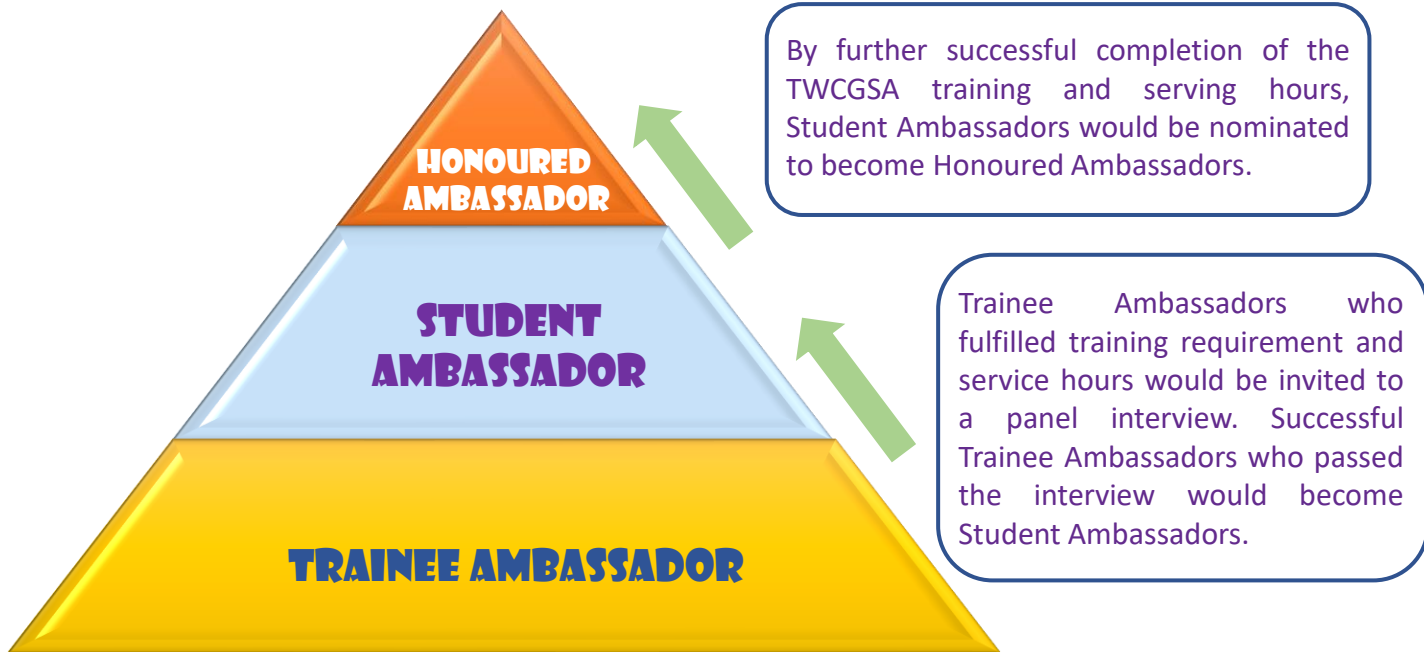
Eligibility

All full-time students of Tung Wah College are eligible to apply for the programme !



Levels of Ambassadorship

There are 3 levels of ambassadorship in GSA. To start with, participants joining the Programme will become **Trainee Ambassadors**. They need to fulfill some specific requirements and trainings before they can progress to **Student Ambassadors** and **Honoured Ambassadors**.



Students who completed Student Activities Fund (SAF) or Student Development Fund (SDF) successfully or who are the nominee of TWC Outstanding Student Award would become the Trainee Ambassadors of the programme.



Level 1 - Trainee Ambassador

At this level, the programme aims to enrich students' global awareness and experience, promote civic engagement among students and enhance their intercultural understanding.

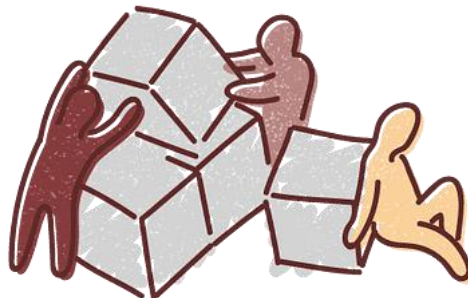
Trainee Ambassadors need to fulfill the requirements under all three categories including Training Programme, Ambassadorship Service Hours and Panel Interview before they can progress to become "Student Ambassadors".

I. Training Programme

Training sessions will be provided to equip students with necessary knowledge, skills, values and experience that will prepare them to be qualified global student ambassadors.

Trainee Ambassadors are required to attend **at least TWO training programmes** under the three main categories including **Leadership & Soft Skills**, **Global Culture** and **Global Concern** (the two training programmes should not belong to the same category).

A. Leadership & Soft Skills

Upon completion of the training programmes, students will be able to develop leadership skills and other soft skills. They would become more culturally sensitive who would always be aware of global concern issues and corresponding responsibilities. Those trainings could also widen their horizon and enrich their knowledge of different culture.

II. Ambassadorship Service Hours



Trainee Ambassadors are required to:

- Complete at least one **community services** organised by the SAO for gaining service hours. (Please refer to the table of training programmes on P.14 - 15)
- Participate in or provide assistance to the **Global Festival**.

III. Panel interview

Trainee ambassadors who completed training programme and service hours as required will be invited to an interview before progressing to become “**Student Ambassadors**”. Academic result and disciplinary record would be considered. The interview panel consists of three SAO staffs as appointed by the Head of Student Affairs.



Level 2 - Student Ambassador

Student Ambassador aims to develop leadership and initiative through self-directed projects and promote cultural awareness by sharing results at the Global Festival.

Student Ambassadors must fulfil the following requirements to progress to become “Honoured Ambassadors”:

- Continue participating in training programmes and complete community service with the same requirements as Level 1.
- Design and conduct a **project** focused on **Global Concern** or **Community Services**.
- Present project findings at the **Global Festival**.
- Participate in a **Panel Interview**
- **Represent the College** at important occasions as arranged by the SAO
- Opportunity to **outreaching activities**, including outbound tours organised by the SAO



Level 2 - Student Ambassador

Global Concern Team and Community Service Team

Besides the participation in the College's services, the promoted Student Ambassadors are encouraged to design and conduct a **project** focused on Global Concern or Community Services.

Suggested topics: **Ethnic Minorities, Poverty, Aging in the world, environment protection, Wars, etc...**



Level 3 – Honoured Ambassador

By further successful completion of the TWCGSA training and serving hours, Student Ambassadors would be appointed to become Honoured Ambassadors by SAO.

Honoured Ambassadors might be assigned to be the leader of committee members of Student Ambassador Programme and to initiate/organize activities for Trainee Ambassadors.

Exclusive privilege will be given to Honoured Ambassadors:

- Receive a one-time award of HK\$3000
- Being representatives of the College to attend external events and important occasions
- Priority of joining outreaching activities including outbound tour organized by SAO
- Getting a Honoured Ambassador **pin** and **certificate** for recognition

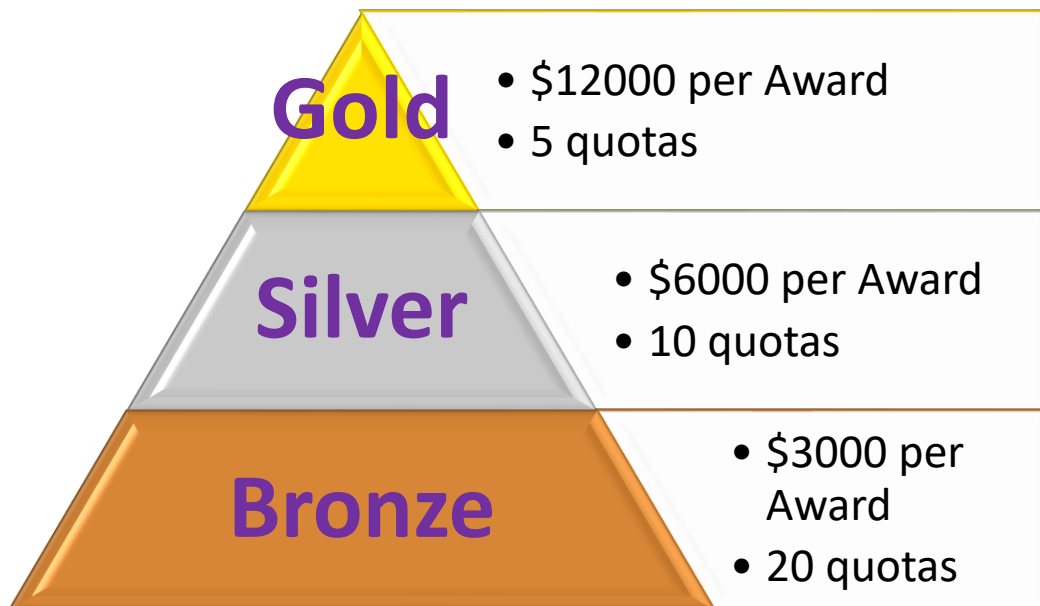


Global Engagement Award (GEA)

Objective

- Acknowledge students who demonstrate exceptional commitment to global engagement through participation in TWC Global Student Ambassador, thereby promoting a culture of active involvement within the college.
- Provide students with opportunities to broaden their global awareness and experience, fostering skills that are essential for success in an increasingly interconnected world.

Three levels of the Award



Nominations and Application

Ambassadors earn points by joining different activities, community services, or initiating community services approved by the SAO

Activity	Points per Activity
Training Programmes	30

Mass event (e.g. Global Festival) - organizing committee	80

Ambassadors must fulfill the following requirements

Award	Requirement
Gold	400 points
Silver	200 points
Bronze	100 points

- Both nominations by SAO staff and applications by ambassadors are accepted
- Submission deadline: 30 April of each academic year
- Travel period: 1 June of the same year to 31 May of the following year
- Required submissions: Application form and self-recommendation letter

Global Awareness Outstanding Award



Eligibility

Both of the **Student Ambassador** and **Honoured Ambassador** are eligible to compete for the Global Awareness Outstanding Award. Students have to propose topics regarding some critical local or global issues and carry out a group research project.

Selection Criteria

Assessment will be conducted on the basis of:

- a. Topic:** Level of creativity, sharpness and uniqueness of the topic.
- b. Research and analysis:** Researching and analysis skills should be well demonstrated.
- c. Solution:** The solution should be practical and feasible. Innovative ideas which could be applied locally and provide benefit to the community are preferred.



Global Awareness Outstanding Award



Approval and Subsidy

All projects are required to obtain approval from Head of Student Affairs before carrying out. Approved project would be entitled to receiving up to \$1,500 research fund on reimbursement basis.

Awards

There are four types of award: **Champion**, **First Runner-up**, **Second Runner-up** and **Merit Award**. Awardees would be presented the awards in the Scholarship and Award Presentation Ceremony which is an annual event of the College.
