### **Tung Wah College (TWC)**

is a self-financing tertiary education institution established by Tung Wah Group of Hospitals (TWGHs) which is the oldest and largest charitable organisation in Hong Kong providing a wide range of medical and health, education and community services to fulfil the needs of the society. The College went through the Insitutional Review (IR) by the Hong Kong Council for Accreditation of Academic and Vocational Qualifications (HKCAAVQ) in 2010 and is registered under the Post-Secondary Colleges Ordinance (Cap. 320) as an approved self-financing degree granting institution.

Taking advantage of TWGHs' strengths and expertise in medical and health, education, and social services etc., TWC aspires to become a renowned privately-funded university, recognised for high quality programmes focusing on practical application for both for-profit and non-profit organisations, while nurturing youngsters to be caring citizens with a sense of social responsibility.

Currently the College offers degree and sub-degree programmes in diverse disciplines (including Social and Business Sustainability, Health Information and Services Management, Applied Psychology, Early Childhood Education, Medical Science, Medical Laboratory Science, Radiation Therapy, Occupational Therapy, Physiotherapy, Nursing and Applied Gerontology etc.) through four Schools, namely School of Arts and Humanities, School of Management, School of Medical and Health Sciences, and School of Nursing. The College has a student population of over 3,500 and has nurtured over 4,600 graduates.

Students taking the above SSSDP degree programmes are eligible for an annual subsidy of \$78,280 for Bachelor of Health Science (Hons) in Nursing, Bachelor of Science (Hons) in Medical Laboratory Science, Bachelor of Science (Hons) in Radiation Therapy, Bachelor of Science (Hons) in Occupational Therapy and Bachelor of Science (Hons) in Physiotherapy, and \$44,950 for Bachelor of Science (Hons)

in Applied Gerontology in 2023/2024. For students of the two SSSDP sub-degree programmes, the annual subsidy is \$38,520 in 2022/2023. Students admitted into other degree programmes (including first & senior year entry) are also eligible for the Government's Non-means-tested Subsidy Scheme for Self-financing Undergraduate Studies in Hong Kong (NMTSS). In 2022/2023, the NMTSS subsidy is \$33,200.



The programme provides the foundation training for adopting a career in Medical Laboratory Science. The first year of study will mainly focus on General Education and foundation scientific learning.

From the second year onwards, students will be taught the principles and practice of the 4 major specialties of Medical Laboratory Science:

**Anatomical & Cellular Pathology**, Chemical Pathology,

Haematology & Transfusion Science, and Medical Microbiology & Virology.

After successful completion of these courses, there will be a 12-week clinical practicum in the first semester of the fourth year, which students will receive practical training in public and/ or private hospital medical laboratories.

### **Programme Objectives**

- To develop students' competence in medical testing with a wide knowledge base in the application of analytical science in medicine;
- To equip the students with critical and analytical thinking skills for solving complex clinical problems in laboratory medicine; and
- To prepare the students to be an effective and efficient healthcare practitioner for participation in contemporary clinical care paths.

### **Career Prospects & Further Studies**

- Graduates will mainly be employed by private and public medical laboratories, including those of the Department of Health, the Hospital Authority, private hospitals and clinics.
- Graduates may choose to pursue a career in business through employment as a technical specialist in local and overseas in vitro diagnostics firms.
- Graduates interested in pursuing further studies may choose to attend graduate school in local or overseas institutions for higher degrees (Master or Doctorate).

- Applicants are expected to have studied Chemistry/ Combined Science (including Chemistry) as one of their elective subjects. Preference will be given to applicants who have obtained Level 4 or above in HKDSE.

- It is expected that prospective students should possess other foundation scientific knowledge e.g. Biology in order to benefit from learning.





### **General Admission Requirements**

### **DEGREE PROGRAMMES**

### **Year 1 Entry**

For Year 1 entry to degree programmes, applicants should meet one of the following requirements:

- 1. Have obtained Level 3 in Chinese Language and English Language<sup>A</sup> and Level 2 in Mathematics and Liberal Studies plus one Elective/Applied Learning Subject at Level 2 ("3322+2") in HKDSE; OR
- 2. Have passes in AS Use of English and AS Chinese Language and Culture plus one AL subject/two AS subjects in HKALE and Level 2 for Chinese Language and English Language plus passes in three other subjects in HKCEE; OR
- 3. Have obtained the International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma with a minimum score of 24 and fulfilled the English language requirements:
  - i. Grade 4 or better in the Higher Level English Language (B Syllabus); or
  - ii. Grade 5 or better in the Standard Level English Language (B Syllabus); or
  - iii. Grade 4 or better in the Higher or Standard Level English Language (A1 or A2 Syllabus); or
  - iv. Grade 4 or better in the Standard Level English Text and Performance; or
  - v. Grade 4 or better in the Standard Level English Literature and Performance (A1 syllabus); OR
- 4. Have met the 2nd cut-off line \* of the respective province for admission to mainland key universities in the National Joint College Entrance Examination (JEE) and the scores of English Language is over 100 (普通高等學校聯合招生考試 (JEE, PRC) 達到所屬省市報讀第二批重點高校分數線 \* 以上及英語科達100分或以上); OR
- 5. Have obtained equivalent qualifications (such as meeting the admission requirements of a degree programme offered outside Hong Kong).

### **Senior Year Entry**

Individual undergraduate programmes admit students for senior year entry. Applicants should meet one of the following requirements:

- 1. Have completed an Associate Degree Programme (AD) or Higher Diploma Programme (HD) of the relevant subject/discipline; OR
- 2. Have obtained equivalent qualifications.

Students admitted to the Senior Year may be required to satisfactorily complete some bridging courses. The bridging courses can be Discipline courses or General Education courses offered in the first two years of the curriculum.

### **SUB-DEGREE PROGRAMMES**

### **Year 1 Entry**

For Year 1 entry to sub-degree programmes, applicants should meet one of the following requirements:

- 1. Have obtained Level 2 in five HKDSE subjects including Chinese Language and English Language<sup>A</sup> ("22+222"). (Each applicant is allowed to use not more than two Applied Learning subjects in the application); OR
- 2. Have obtained a pass in one AL subject or passes in two AS subjects in HKALE and five passes in HKCEE including Chinese Language and English Language; OR
- 3. Have obtained a pass in one AL subject or passes in two AS subjects in HKALE and three passes in HKCEE plus Level 2 for Chinese Language and English Language; OR
- 4. Have successfully completed a Pre-Associate Degree programme; OR
- 5. Have successfully completed Diploma Yi Jin programme; OR
- 6. Have obtained equivalent qualifications; OR
- 7. Have reached the age of 21 or above.

(Note: Mainland applicants with National Joint College Entrance Examination (JEE) results will also be considered. 持普通高等學校聯合招生考試成績之內地申請人亦將予以個別考慮。

^ Students with HKDSE English Language results at Level 3 or below are required to complete non-credit bearing English enhancement course(s) in the first year of study.

### **Graduation Requirements**

To be considered for the award of a qualification, a student shall:

- 1. Have completed the minimum required credit units as prescribed for the programme with a Cumulative Grade Point Average (cGPA) of at least 2.0 for students who are admitted before 2013/2014; or with a Graduation Grade Point Average (gGPA) of at least 2.0 for students who are admitted in or after 2013/2014;
- 2. Have achieved GPA of 1.0 or above for all courses in the programme;
- 3. Have satisfied the requirements of the graduation project / practicum, if any, as prescribed for the academic programme;
- 4. Have completed the Work-Integrated Learning Programme / Co-operative Education Scheme / Community Service Programme required by the programme; and
