About Tung Wah College



Tung Wah College (TWC) is a self-financing tertiary education institution established by Tung Wah Group of Hospitals (TWGHs) which is the oldest and largest charitable organisation in Hong Kong providing a wide range of medical and health, education and community services to fulfil the needs of the society. The College went through the Institutional Review (IR) by the Hong Kong Council for Accreditation of Academic and Vocational Qualifications (HKCAAVQ) in 2010 and is registered under the Post-Secondary Colleges Ordinance (Cap. 320) as an approved self-financing degree granting institution.

Taking advantage of TWGHs' strengths and expertise in medical and health, education, and social services etc., TWC aspires to become a renowned privately-funded university, recognised for high quality programmes focusing on practical application for both for-profit and non-profit organisations, while nurturing youngsters to be caring citizens with a sense of social responsibility.

Currently the College offers degree and sub-degree programmes in diverse disciplines (including Social and Business Sustainability, Applied Psychology, Early Childhood Education, Medical Science, Medical Laboratory Science, Radiation Therapy, Occupational Therapy, Physiotherapy, Nursing and Applied Gerontology etc.) through four Schools, namely School of Arts and Humanities, School of Management, School of Medical and Health Sciences, and School of Nursing. The College has a student population of over 3,400 and has nurtured over 3,800 graduates.

Students taking the above SSSDP degree programmes are eligible for an annual subsidy of \$77,040 for Bachelor of Health Science (Hons) in Nursing, Bachelor of Science (Hons) in Medical Laboratory Science, Bachelor of Science (Hons) in Radiation Therapy, Bachelor of Science (Hons) in Occupational Therapy and Bachelor of Science (Hons) in Physiotherapy, and \$44,240 for Bachelor of Science (Hons) in Applied Gerontology in 2022/2023. For students of the two SSSDP sub-degree programmes, the annual subsidy is \$38,400 in 2022/2023. Students admitted into other degree programmes (including first & senior year entry) are also eligible for the Government's Non-means-tested Subsidy Scheme for Self-financing Undergraduate Studies in Hong Kong (NMTSS). In 2021/2022, the NMTSS subsidy is \$33,100.

PROGRAMME DESCRIPTION

The programme aims to equip students with comprehensive theoretical and practical knowledge of psychology and enables them to apply this knowledge in social welfare, educational, healthcare and various work settings. Graduates can pursue careers in psychology and related fields as well as further study in professional areas of psychology. The programme objectives are:

- (1) To equip students with critical thinking, problem-solving, and research skills necessary to conduct scientific studies;
- (2) To develop students' interpersonal competencies in self-awareness, appreciation and acceptance of individual differences and cultural diversity as well as their commitment to ethical and professional behaviours;
- (3) To facilitate students to apply theories and principles of psychology to individual, societal and global issues;
- (4) To equip students with effective communication skills to tackle the needs in diverse settings;
- (5) To build students' competencies required for entry into graduate or professional school, or for entry into the world of work.

PROFESSIONAL RECOGNITION

Graduates are eligible to apply for membership of the Hong Kong Psychological Society (HKPS), British Psychological Society (BPS) and Australian Psychological Society (APS). (membership applications are assessed on an individual basis).



CAREER PROSPECTS AND FURTHER STUDIES

- Graduates are equipped with the knowledge, skills and values to work in social sciences/psychology related fields and settings such as social work and services, public relations and communications, politics, personnel, advertising, management and retail.
- Graduates can take up teaching and research due to their capacity for independent thinking, problem-solving ability and highly developed interpersonal skills.
- Graduates of the Programme could further study in a postgraduate programme in Psychology and related disciplines, such as clinical psychology, counselling, educational or organisational psychology or a professional in other specialised fields of psychology.
- Postgraduate training and study is a requirement to become a chartered/registered professional psychologist.

- Graduates can enter the career in human and social care services including psychological service assistants, counselling assistants, welfare workers, marketing assistants, human resource assistants and student development assistants.
- Graduates with satisfactory performance can articulate to senior year entry of the Bachelor of Social Science (Honours) in Applied Psychology at TWC, or relevant bachelor's degree programmes at other institutions.

PROGRAMME DESCRIPTION

This programme aims to prepare students for professional careers in early childhood settings. Students will learn the theory and pedagogy of Early Childhood Education to meet the needs of caring and educating young children (0 to 8 years of age). The programme objectives are:

- (1) To apply knowledge and skills to various childcare or early childhood educational settings.
- (2) To design curriculum which suits the diverse learning and/or developmental needs of children across the changing socio-economic and educational environment.
- (3) To demonstrate competence in integrating knowledge and skills to work with children with diverse needs in early childhood education and their families.
- (4) To demonstrate competence to undertake independent fieldwork across different childcare or early childhood educational settings.
- (5) To utilise critical thinking in constructing arguments about contemporary issues in early childhood education.
- (6) To display leadership across various childcare or early childhood educational settings through utilizing global perspectives.

PROFESSIONAL RECOGNITION*

- Graduates are recognised by the Education Bureau as meeting the requirement for registration as Qualified Kindergarten Teachers under the Education Ordinance,
- Graduates are also eligible for registration as Child Care Workers (CCW), Child Care Supervisors (CCS) and Special Child Care Workers (SCCW) under the Child Care Services Ordinance of the Social Welfare Department (SWD).

PROGRAMME DESCRIPTION

The programme equips students with the professional knowledge, skills and professional ethics in early childhood education. The students can also acquire the necessary strategies to perform competently in the care and education of young children aged 8 or below in various early childhood settings in Hong Kong. The programme objectives are:

- (1) To apply knowledge about the theories and process of child development;
- (2) To describe the interconnectedness between socio-demographic, economic, political and cultural changes and the development of childcare sectors with particular reference to Hong Kong;
- (3) To apply the knowledge and skills in planning, implementing and evaluating contemporary early childhood curriculum and programmes appropriate to the early childhood education settings;
- (4) To integrate the understanding of special educational needs of children with developmental challenges in early childhood education;
- (5) To utilise critical, analytical and problem-solving skills;
- (6) To apply effective interpersonal skills in communication with child care professionals, children and parents in early childhood settings;
- (7) To demonstrate the educational and professional responsibilities in early childhood settings; and
- (8) To recognise the capacity for continuous independent learning and reflective practice.

PROFESSIONAL RECOGNITION*

UNIQUE PROGRAMME FEATURES

 - (3) Use futures thinking to develop strategies to achieve a more desirable future;
 - (4) Measure the social impact of organisational programmes and activities.
- Students gain practical experience through work internships and capstone projects.
- Students participate in overseas study tours to appreciate how social problems are addressed in other countries.

PROGRAMME DESCRIPTION

The programme aims to prepare students with firm scientific knowledge and technical expertise. It also provides a scientific foundation for students who intend to pursue postgraduate studies in professional medical and health disciplines such as medicine, dentistry, chiropractic, veterinary science, nursing, physiotherapy etc. The programme objectives are:

- (1) to provide students with an understanding of the concepts of biomedical and forensic science;
- (2) to develop student's keen interest in science through critical, creative and problem-solving skills and provide insights into biological science area such as biomedical and forensic science fields;
- (3) to produce graduates that are well equipped with the knowledge to pursue further postgraduate professional programmes and/or pursue careers in biomedical and forensic science fields; and
- (4) to enhance students' communication and interpersonal skills (general and professional), understanding and appreciation of other cultures and environments.

PROGRAMME-SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS

Preference will be given to applicants who have obtained Level 2 or above in Integrated Science or Combined Science in HKDSE.



CAREER PROSPECTS AND FURTHER STUDIES

- Basic Medical Sciences students will be prepared as pre-professional graduates who can become eligible to enter medicine, dentistry, chiropractic, Chinese medicine and veterinary science in the region or overseas.
- Basic Medical Sciences graduates may pursue postgraduate research degrees (MPhil and PhD) to enter academic careers as they will have the attributes of fundamental laboratory skills, an inquisitive mind and problem-solving skills.
- Opportunities for Forensic Science graduates will be available at the Hong Kong Police Force, the Fire Services, the Customs and Excise Department, and the Agriculture, Fisheries and Conservation Department of the Hong Kong Government.
- Forensic Science graduates have opportunities to be employed by laboratories that conduct testing, sampling as well as Sales representatives of equipment manufacturers.

Programme Information



PROGRAMME DESCRIPTION

The programme provides the foundation training for adopting a career in Medical Laboratory Science. The first year of study will mainly focus on general education and foundation scientific learning. From the second year onwards, students will be taught the principles and practice of the 4 major specialties of Medical Laboratory Science: Anatomical & Cellular Pathology, Chemical Pathology, Haematology & Transfusion Science, and Medical Microbiology & Virology. After successful completion of these courses, there will be a 12-week clinical practicum in the first semester of the fourth year, which students will receive practical training in public

and/ or private hospital medical laboratories. The programme objectives are:

- (1) To develop students' competence in medical testing with a wide knowledge base in the application of analytical science in medicine;
- (2) To equip the students with critical and analytical thinking skills for solving complex clinical problems in laboratory medicine; and
- (3) To prepare the students to be an effective and efficient healthcare practitioner for participation in contemporary clinical care paths.

PROGRAMME-SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS

PROGRAMME DESCRIPTION

The first year of study will mainly concentrate on General Education and some fundamental scientific learning in Radiotherapy. The programme aims to prepare students to become professional physiotherapists that meet the requirements of the local registration board and international entry-level physiotherapy education standards. The programme objectives are:

- Graduates may pursue further study for career advancement and are eligible to apply for learning programmes at QF level 4.

In 2022/2023 academic year, the annual subsidy under the SSSDP is \$77,040 for laboratory-based undergraduate programmes. The annual subsidy amount may vary in each academic year subject to the decision by the Education Bureau.
- (6) The tuition fee for the programme under the Study Subsidy Scheme for Designated Professions/Sectors (SSSDP) is the net fee paid by a student after deduction of subsidy from the Government and subject to the final approval by the Education Bureau. The annual subsidy amount may vary in each academic year subject to the decision by the Education Bureau.
- (7) The tuition fee for the programme under the Study Subsidy Scheme for Designated Professions/Sectors (SSSDP) is the net fee paid by a student after deduction of subsidy from the Government. In 2022/2023 academic year, the annual subsidy under the Project is \$44,240. The annual subsidy amount may vary in each academic year subject to the decision by the Education Bureau.

General Admission Requirements

DEGREE PROGRAMMES

Year 1 Entry

For Year 1 entry to degree programmes, applicants should meet one of the following requirements:

1. Have obtained Level 3 in Chinese Language and English Language and Level 2 in Mathematics and Liberal Studies plus one Elective/Applied Learning Subject at Level 2 ("3322+2") in HKDSE; OR
2. Have passes in AS Use of English and AS Chinese Language and Culture plus one AL subject/two AS subjects in HKALE and Level 2 for Chinese Language and English Language plus passes in three other subjects in HKCEE; OR
3. Have obtained the International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma with a minimum score of 24 and fulfilled the English language requirements:
 - i. Grade 4 or better in the Higher Level English Language (B Syllabus); or
 - ii. Grade 5 or better in the Standard Level English Language (B Syllabus); or
 - iii. Grade 4 or better in the Higher or Standard Level English Language (A1 or A2 Syllabus); or
 - iv. Grade 4 or better in the Standard Level English - Text and Performance; or
 - v. Grade 4 or better in the Standard Level English - Literature and Performance (A1 syllabus); OR
4. Have met the 2nd cut-off line of the respective province for admission to mainland key universities in the National Joint College Entrance Examination (JEE) and the scores of English Language is over 100 (普通高等學校聯合招生考試 (JEE, PRC) 達到所屬省市報讀第二批重點高校分數線以上及英語科達100分或以上) *Or the "cut-off line for undergraduate studies" (for provinces and cities where the 1st and 2nd cut-off lines are combined) 或「本科批次」分數線 (適用於「本科一批」及「本科二批」合併為「本科批次」的省市); OR
5. Have obtained equivalent qualifications (such as meeting the admission requirements of a degree programme offered outside Hong Kong).

Senior Year Entry

Individual undergraduate programmes admit students for senior year entry. Applicants should meet one of the following requirements:

1. Have completed an Associate Degree Programme (AD) or Higher Diploma Programme (HD) of the relevant subject/discipline; OR
2. Have obtained equivalent qualifications.

Students admitted to the Senior Year may be required to satisfactorily complete some bridging courses. The bridging courses can be Discipline courses or General Education courses offered in the first two years of the curriculum.

SUB-DEGREE PROGRAMMES

Year 1 Entry

For Year 1 entry to sub-degree programmes, applicants should meet one of the following requirements:

1. Have obtained Level 2 in five HKDSE subjects, including Chinese Language and English Language ("22+222"). (Each applicant is allowed to use not more than two Applied Learning subjects in the application); OR
2. Have obtained a pass in one AL subject or passes in two AS subjects in HKALE and five passes in HKCEE including Chinese Language and English Language; OR
3. Have obtained a pass in one AL subject or passes in two AS subjects in HKALE and three passes in HKCEE plus Level 2 for Chinese Language and English Language; OR
4. Have successfully completed a Pre-Associate Degree programme; OR
5. Have successfully completed Diploma Yi Jin programme; OR
6. Have obtained equivalent qualifications; OR
7. Have reached the age of 21 or above.

(Note: Mainland applicants with National Joint College Entrance Examination (JEE) results will also be considered.

ALTERNATIVE CHINESE LANGUAGE (ACL) FOR NON-CHINESE SPEAKING STUDENTS

1. Students obtained the minimum grade in the Chinese Language under GCE, GCSE and IGCSE.

2. Student obtained the grade "Attained", "Attained with Distinction (I)" or "Attained with Distinction (II)" in the Applied Learning Chinese (ApL(C)). The recognition of the ApL subjects is as follows:

- "Attained" is comparable to Level 2 in the HKDSE Examination, which is qualified to apply for Sub-Degree programmes only;
- "Attained with Distinction (I)" is comparable to Level 3 in the HKDSE Examination, which is qualified to apply for BOTH Undergraduate and Sub-degree programmes;
- "Attained with Distinction (II)" is comparable to Level 4 or above in the HKDSE Examination, which is qualified to apply for BOTH Undergraduate and Sub-degree programmes.

Graduation Requirements

To be considered for the award of a qualification, a student shall:

1. Have completed the minimum required credit units as prescribed for the programme with a Graduation Grade Point Average (gGPA) of at least 2.0;
2. Have achieved GPA of 1.0 or above for all courses in the programme;
3. Have satisfied the requirements of the graduation project / practicum, if any, as prescribed for the academic programme;
4. Have completed the Work Integrated Learning Programme / Community Service programme, if any, as required by the programme; and
5. Have attained a valid score of 6.0 in IELTS or equivalent (for degree-level programmes only). (Students would be considered as having fulfilled the requirement if they have obtained a valid score in IELTS or equivalent at the commencement of the programme.)
